The Bunker Cemetery is just off the main road, 1.2 miles from the dock, on the west (right) side. It is easily recognized by its surrounding chain-link fence.

It contains 85 major stones inscribed with

names and dates (not counting footstones or other minor markers), but 98 individuals are interred. The numbers don't match because many stones mark both husband and wife, and the Bunker obelisk (G-4) marks a family -- albeit two captains were buried in Portland, Maine, and one captain was buried at sea.



The oldest stone is dated <u>1825</u>, and the latest, 1994.

Layout of the Cemetery

The overall dimensions of the cemetery are approximately 150 feet long and 84 feet wide. The longest dimension lies east/west. A chain-link fence surrounds the cemetery on only three sides. The back (west side) of the cemetery is unfenced, with a steep drop-off of about 5 feet, down an old stone retaining wall. The chain-link fence doesn't go all the way to the back of the cemetery -- it lacks 9 feet on the northern side and 4 feet on the southern side. The two front corners of the cemetery are defined by the corner fence posts but, because of the gaps, the two back corners are defined by metal re-bars (reinforcement bars, about 3/8 inch thick) driven into the earth.

The 10-foot wide entrance on the east side, facing the main road, has a double-swinging chain-link gate. It is placed 23 feet from the north end, and 51 feet from the south end of the cemetery. The front of the cemetery (and the gate) is approximately 10 feet from the main road.

Authors' Comments

Early History

As far as we can tell, the earliest birth date of those buried in the cemetery is that of Benaiah Bunker (G-8). He died in 1866 at the age of 81, so he was born in 1785, shortly after the end of the Revolutionary War. This was during the period when the United States was under the Articles of Confederation, adopted by the 13 original states in 1781 -- the current Constitution being adopted in 1789.

It is interesting to note that during this period, it was unclear whether the Cranberry Isles -indeed all of what is now Northern Maine -- was part of the U.S. or Canada. During the
Revolutionary War, many Loyalists, wishing to flee the upstart Colonies, moved north to
what they considered would be British Canadian territory when the war ended. As it was the
generally accepted belief that the Penobscot River would mark the eventual boundary, they
settled in Castine (then called Penobscot), on the northern side of the river. But after the war,
it wasn't until 1798 that the final treaty was signed, establishing the current border, at the St.
Croix River, as the true boundary between Massachusetts and Nova Scotia. It isn't too much
of an exaggeration to say that this treaty made U.S. citizens of Benaiah Bunker and his fellow
Cranberry Islanders -- but they became "State o' Maine'ers" only in 1820, when Maine was
created from northern Massachusetts.

It is likely that either Benaiah Bunker or his two probable brothers, <u>Thomas</u> (C-3, 1790-1867) or <u>Joseph</u> (B-7, 1797-1871) was the owner of the Bunker Cemetery land -- they were 40, 35, and 28 years old, respectively, at the time of the first burial in 1825.

The first to be buried is presumably the stone with the earliest date of death. This appears to belong to Ellis Kingsbury (H-3). He died in 1825 at the age of 35, so he was born in 1790 -- about the time that the current Constitution of the United States went into effect. Kingsbury's wife, Comfort, was also born before the new century -- in 1798.

Eight people buried in the cemetery were born in the eighteenth century; they're listed below. Also listed are the first few burials.

Statistics

Of course, the majority of people buried in the Bunker Cemetery are Bunkers. The number of individuals from each family name are as follows:

With so many Bunkers, it was perhaps inevitable that duplicate names would occur. There are three sets of people with identical names in the cemetery. They are:

- * The death date of George W. Bunker is not filled in on <u>G-4</u>, but it must have been in 1896 or after, as 1896 is the latest date inscribed on G-4.
- + The exact month and day of the birth of the later Moses S. Bunker is not recorded on his stone, but it was very likely after the earlier Moses died, in that same year. The later Moses was apparently named after the earlier Moses.

Eleven children, aged 17 or younger, are buried in the cemetery. Given the length of time the cemetery has been in use -- at least 170 years, as of 1995 -- and given the rather high mortality rate of children well into the twentieth century, it is a bit surprising that there are not more children -- only about 11% of the total. Even more surprising is that there are so few interments of children during the nineteenth century -- only seven.

Miscellaneous

The cemetery is just north of the town Road Maintenance Garage. This area used to serve as the town gravel pit, so it's clear that the soil is sandy and easy to dig, with no ledges near the surface.

In September 1994, when we first started this report, the ground was covered with wild red cranberries -- quite the greatest profusion of such berries seen by the authors on this island.


In the cemetery itself, some of the stones have fallen over and lie flat on the ground. These stones will tend to deteriorate faster since acid rain water can collect in the cut faces of the letters comprising the inscription. Other stones show crack fissures, and some few have cracked completely through.

Footstones are sometimes placed near headstones to indicate where the coffin lies, and thus to prevent disturbing an existing grave when digging a new one. All but one of the footstones are small, simple, and are inscribed only with initials. The exception is for Lester C. Bracy (H-12); his footstone essentially duplicates the information on his headstone.

Several stones include names of people still living, or recently deceased, for which dates of death are not inscribed. There are 5 people who are still alive at this time (July 1995) but whose names are mentioned on the stones:

Note: The fence doesn't extend all the way to the drop-off at the back of the cemetery. There's a gap of 9' on the northern side, and 4' on the southern side.

The following list gives our best rendering of all the inscriptions. A few inscriptions are pitted and difficult or impossible to read, or have unknown words in places. Some extra work with rubbings, by a person with a good poetic imagination, could probably clear up all but the one or two eroded inscriptions. 





Note: the tens digit of the year of death is illegible, and only the top half of the units digit is clear. It appears to be round on top and on both sides. The rounded top extends downward (with no horizontal lines) too far down on both sides to be a "2", "3", "6", "8", or "9". It must be a "0".

Also, the numerical age, apparently inscribed on the following line, is totally illegible but the letters following the age seem to be "...n's", as in "mon's". If so, there is no room on the stone for "x yr's y mon's", so we conclude that the original inscription did not include years, i.e. the child was an infant, less than 1 year old.

Table of Names in Alphabetical Order

This table duplicates all the names mentioned in the inscriptions, but here they're in alphabetical order by family name, so you can find a particular name easily by eye. Click the grave coordinate -- immediately to the left of the given name -- to see the inscription.

Please be aware that a person may be mentioned on more than one inscription. They may have their own stone, as well as being mentioned on another stone as "son of ..." or "father of ..." for example. However, the table has only one link to an inscription. It may not be the only reference. So study the inscriptions carefully for multiple references.

Stones with "dau. of ..." are especially useful as they reveal a woman's maiden name. Where possible, I've listed women under both their maiden and married names.

Family members were often buried close to each other. Note but **don't** click on the grave coordinate immediately to the left of the given name. Then click on the cemetery name just to the left of that, to go to the grave site layout, and click on nearby stones to see their inscriptions.
