The Preble Cemetery, Great Cranberry Island, Maine

The Preble Cemetery is at the end of a short footpath off the main road, just south of the tennis court. The cemetery is in the midst of spruce and birch trees, surrounded by a traditional white picket fence. It contains 56 headstones; the oldest is dated 1840, and the latest, 1990.

Perhaps most touching of the stones are those of the three children Mildred, Jennie, and Harley Rosebrook (2d-f), who died within one week of each other in late September, 1898. Other curious inscriptions are those of Harding (1a), Rosa Spurling (3g), Mary Moore and Hannah Stanley (5h), and Josiah Young (7a).

Since most inscriptions face west, the best time to visit the cemetery is in the early afternoon, when the sun shines onto the faces of the stones from above, throwing the incised letters into clear relief.

Layout of the Cemetery

The overall dimensions of the cemetery are 95 feet long and 55.5 feet wide. The longest dimension lies east/west.

There are 56 headstones and 24 footstones in the cemetery. All the graves lie to the east of the headstones except those against the eastern fence. All inscriptions face west except those on the stones against the western fence, and on the back of Amy Young's stone (5e).

All but one (10b) of the footstones are small and simple: just blank or inscribed with initials. They indicate where the coffin lies, to prevent disturbing an existing grave when digging a new one.

The 8-foot entrance on the east side, facing the main road, shows no evidence of a gate or closure. Its width matches the 8-foot 1.5-inch door frame opening of the "Hearse House" structure built on the back of the island church, so it seems likely that the hearse was driven directly into the cemetery for burials.

There was a 4.5-foot double-swinging gate near the northwest corner of the cemetery, probably intended as a convenient access to the well-known footpath to Preble Cove. The eastern half of this gate was missing in 1994, when the first study of the cemetery was done. Maintenance work by the Alley Family in 1998 sealed off the gate by extending the fence over it.

The surrounding wooden picket fence is supported by 0.75-inch solid iron rods at the end of each fence section, driven into the ground or into large stones. Thus the fence structure did not depend on typical buried wooden support posts, which would tend to rot and weaken in a few short years.

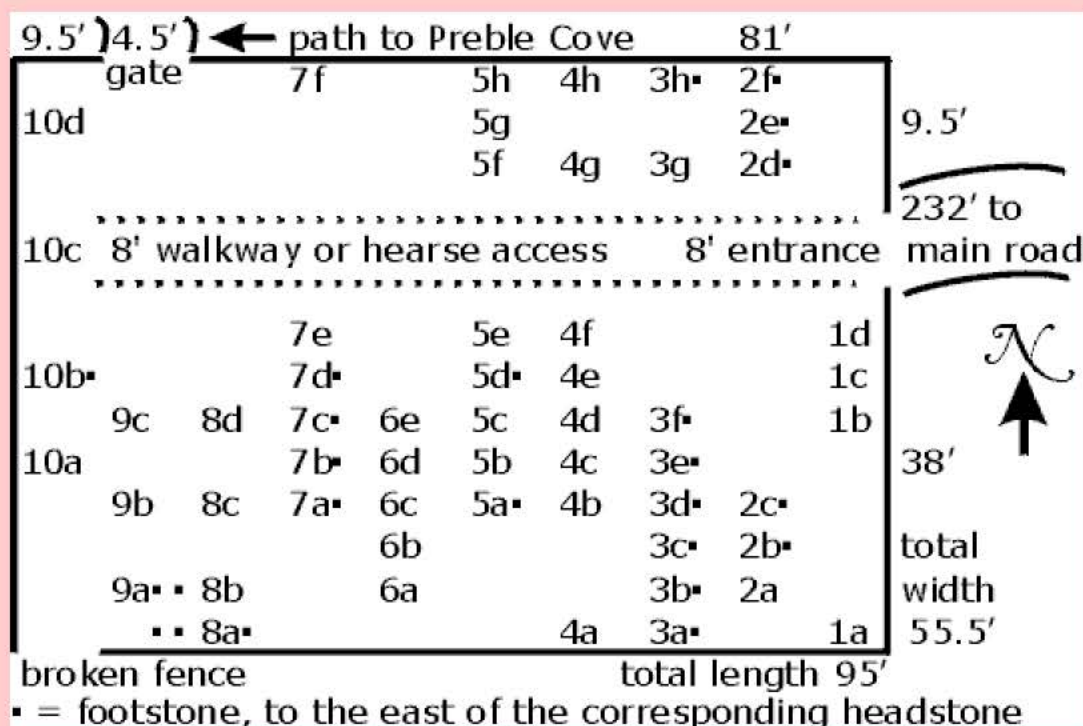
In 1994 the picket fence was in need of repair where occasionally a blown-down tree had smashed the tops of some of the pickets; it also needed some paint. The 1998 renovation by the Alleys included replacing and/or renailling loose pickets, and painting the entire fence white.

In the cemetery itself, some of the stones have fallen over and lie flat on the ground. These stones will tend to deteriorate faster since acid rain water can collect in the cut faces of the letters comprising the inscription. Other stones show crack fissures, some few have cracked completely through, and on two stones the first name has been cracked off and lost.

Grave Site Layout

To "stroll through" the cemetery:

1. click on a stone to see the inscription
2. click your browser's "Back" button to return here to the cemetery



Inscriptions

The following preliminary list gives my best rendering of all the inscriptions. One or two inscriptions are pitted and difficult or impossible to read. Two others have unknown words in places. Some extra work with rubbings, by a person with a good poetic imagination, could probably clear up all but the one or two eroded inscriptions. I welcome corrections from old family records or from your own personal research.

Notes

The text above was mostly taken from the printed document published by the Great Cranberry Historical Society in 1994. However, some corrections have been made in this new internet edition. This text, and everything that follows is new, added by me to facilitate genealogical research on the web.

Sorting the database by DIED date, we see that the first interment was Mary S. Moore (5h) in 1840, but curiously, the first stones were placed in the cemetery only in 1856: see Eber M. Preble (2c), and Hannah S. Stanley (5h.)

There have been no burials in the Preble Cemetery since this list was compiled in 1994. Mickey Macfarlan is the only additional person anticipated to be buried in the cemetery.

Maintenance

In the fall of 1998, Cleo Alley and his wife Donna (Beal) Alley, arrived with a gang of kids and, as a family project, spent several days putting the Preble Cemetery into shape. They cut the trees and brush from the cemetery and about 12 feet around the outside. They trimmed the grass and bushes, repaired and painted the fence, and scrubbed and bleached the headstones. They also stood the stones up that had fallen over and leveled the ones that were leaning. They found several stones that were covered and set them up as best they could.

They returned again in the fall of 1999 to epoxy some of the broken stones, do a general cleanup, and finish the job.

Cleo writes: "This has been a family project, and it's kind of heartwarming to know my family cares enough to do this. Those involved were: Cleo and Donna Alley (her parents are Clarence and Barbara Beal, who are buried in the Preble Cemetery, along with her grandparents, and other relatives); my oldest son Michael Alley, his wife Anita, and their daughter Amber; my youngest son David Alley, his wife Loni, and their children Frank, David, Jason, Jared and Sara; my youngest daughter Melissa Manheim, her husband Kevin, and their children Jessica, Jaime, Jeremy, Jennifer, Jodi, and Tyler; and Annie and Harry Alley and their son Mark. Harry Alley is also a half brother of Clarence Beal, and their mother Clara Alley and Harry's brother Leroy are also buried there."

Table of Names in Alphabetical Order

This table duplicates all the names mentioned in the inscriptions, but here they're in alphabetical order by family name, so you can find a particular name easily by eye. Click the grave coordinate -- immediately to the left of the given name -- to see the inscription.

Please be aware that a person may be mentioned on more than one inscription. They may have their own stone, as well as being mentioned on another stone as "son of ..." or "father of ..." for example. However, the table has only one link to an inscription. **It may not be the only reference.** So study the inscriptions carefully for multiple references.

Stones with "dau. of ..." are especially useful as they reveal a woman's maiden name. Where possible, I've listed women under both their maiden and married names. I've listed Rosa (3g) under both her husbands' family names.

Family members were often buried close to each other.
